2015 Palo Alto City Library Summer Reading Program

The library's 2015 Summer Reading Program (SRP)- themed "Read to the Rhythm"- was a big success this year. The SRP, sponsored by a grant from Friends of the Palo Alto Library, is one of the library's most anticipated programs of the year, and participation lived up to expectations.

Families were encouraged to register together to participate in the SRP, as this program is for all ages, from infants to older adults. The readers set a personal goal for how many books they would like to read, or listen to if not yet reading, during the months of June, July, and August. Participants then logged their books online throughout the summer months, with the option to include book reviews which made the participant eligible to win weekly raffle prizes, generously donated by local businesses.

This year, more than 3,600 customers of all ages participated in the program, and participants read more than 32,000 books between June 1 and August 30. Of particular note was the 40% increase in program participation of adults, and the 35% increase in program participation of children, infant through rising 5th graders, over 2014 participation numbers. The library has begun partnering with schools and community centers in Palo Alto to spread the word about the SRP, and library staff is gratified to see that more people than ever are participating in this worthwhile program.

Originally conceived as a way to help kids maintain their reading skills over the summer vacation, the program has grown into a cherished tradition for many Palo Alto families. Over 35% of those who registered for the 2015 SRP noted that they participate in the SRP every year. Studies show that when children see their parents reading for pleasure, they are more likely to enjoy reading recreationally, and kids who

enjoy reading generally have a better vocabulary and are more successful in school. The SRP also promotes early literacy development in babies by encouraging parents to begin reading with their little ones from day one.

All summer reading participants received a \$5 Book Bucks coupon to spend at the Friends of the Palo Alto Library's monthly booksales. They also received a free paperback book to take home and keep, compliments of a donation from FOPAL. Participants were thrilled to receive these prizes, and many excited readers looked forward to adding to their home library collection by spending their Book Bucks.

Grants from Friends of the Palo Alto Library also allowed the Library to offer a variety of programs for all ages in conjunction with the SRP. The most popular programs were the "Wacky Wednesday" programs, which featured a different children's performer each week in June and July, and which drew over 1300 people to the nine weekly programs. Musical acts, a puppet show, a magician, and an animal show were some of the programs Palo Alto children enjoyed this summer. Family events included a summer reading program kick-off event with free ice cream and Saturday movie matinees at the library. Teen events included a program about the physics of music, as well as a lesson on the art of electronic sound design. Adult programs included a Hollywood movie musical series, a program about the history
